

# Astoria Sunday Drive

Route:  
Start: NW 185th & HWY 26,  
Portland/NW Beaverton

Take HWY 26 to the Coast following  
the signs to SEASIDE

HWY 26 Merges with HWY 101 9 miles  
South of Seaside.

Travel North on HWY101 through  
Seaside. To visit Sunset Beach, Exit  
Sunset Beach Drive (at the Astoria  
Golf & Country Club)

In Astoria, Follow signs to HWY 30,  
(HWY 101 merges with 30 at the  
Bridge).

To Visit Astoria Column, Turn Right on  
16th and follow the signs up the hill.

To continue back toward Portland,  
follow HWY 30 East than SE. To Visit  
Johns Beach, watch for the signs 5-10  
miles before you reach Claskanie.

After Scappoose, begin watching for  
the signs for Cornelius Pass (about 5  
miles). There is a 3 way stoplight. Turn  
right on Cornelius and follow to WEST  
UNION. Turn Left. Follow about 2  
miles to 185th. Turn Right. The  
Freeway and your starting point will  
be one mile ahead.

(On Cornelius Pass you can continue  
forward to HWY 26 which is about a  
mile and take the east bound toward  
Portland. 185th is the next exit)



## Points of Interest

Seaside, Oregon: Resort town and tourist's paradise

Cannon Beach: Famous for its monoliths and a favorite weekend getaway for Oregonians

Tillamook Dairy: Forget Wisconsin, this is where the really good cheese and dairy products come from! Free tours and cheese Sampling

Forrest Grove Wineries: Five wineries are close to our drive: Shafer Vineyard Cellars, Tualatin Estate, David Hill Winery, Momokawa Sake Brewery, Montinore Vineyards

Sunset Beach: The Drive-on beach in Northern Oregon

Fort Stevens State Park: circa: 1864- 3,700 acre park offering exploration of history, nature and recreational opportunities

The Astoria Column: The column artwork illustrates the discovery of the Columbia River by Captain Robert Gray in 1792, the establishment of American claims to the Northwest Territory, the winning of the west and the arrival of the Great Northern Railway.

Johns Beach: ATV beach on the Columbia with unobstructed view of Mt. St. Helens
